- Phillips-head screwdriver (for stand installation)
- Antenna cable (to watch live TV)

Important Tips

- Place the TV on a level surface.
- Place the TV away from any source that may generate heat or vibrations.
- Make sure there is enough space around vents for airflow.
- The remote control works up to 6 metres away from the TV.
- Unplug the TV before cleaning it.
- Clean using a dry cloth only do not use water or chemicals.
- Use only the power supply provided.
- It is highly recommended to use safety straps for securing the TV in place.
- Keep liquid, children and pets away from the TV at all times.

Attaching the stand



- Unplug the TV from the power outlet before installing or removing the stand.
- Only touch the frame, not the screen.
- It is highly recommended to use safety straps for securing the TV.

Unless you are wall-mounting the TV, you will need to attach its stand/legs.

- 1. Lay the TV face-down on a soft, flat surface (like the sofa, or a towel on a table) larger than the TV itself.
- 2. Match the stands to the installation points on the underside of the TV.
- 3. Attach the stands to the TV at the installation points using the screws provided. (Grab a screwdriver for this bit). Make sure the legs are facing away from each other (not leaning inwards).

Wall-mounting the TV

- Unplug the TV from the power outlet before wall-mounting.
- Contact a professional for assistance with wall-mounting the TV.

Required

- VESA Mounting Bracket
- 4 x M4*10mm screws (or longer as required)

The TV comes with holes on the back panel for use with wall-mounting brackets (bracket not included).

Use four standard M4*10mm screws (or longer, depending on the mounting bracket) to wall-mount this TV (screws are not included).



The screws in the package are for securing the TV stand only. If you are wall-mounting the TV, consult a qualified installer for advice on bracket support and wall support.

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Remote Control



Setup

Insert two AAA size batteries according to the polarity markings (+ / -) inside the compartment. Make sure the batteries are correctly aligned and properly pushed into place.

Precautions When Using Batteries

- Do not use old and new batteries together.
- Do not use different types of batteries (e.g. Manganese and Alkaline batteries) together.
- Remove the batteries from the remote if you do not intend to use it for a long time.
- When discarding used batteries, follow any guidelines for recycling and disposal of batteries that apply in your local area.
- Keep batteries away from children and pets.
- Never throw batteries into a fire or expose them to extreme heat.

Using the Remote Control

To use the remote, point it towards the remote sensor at the front of the TV. The remote will not operate if its path is blocked.

The remote has a range of up to about 6 metres from the TV at an angle of up to 30 degrees to either side of the sensor, as illustrated below.



Remote Hints and Tips

- Do not drop, step on or otherwise impact the remote control. This may damage the parts or lead to malfunction.
- Do not place objects between the remote control and the remote sensor.
- Do not use this remote control while simultaneously operating a remote control for other devices.







First Time Setup menu

When you turn the TV on for the first time, the First Time Setup menu will appear.

Follow the prompts using the $\blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown / \blacklozenge / \circlearrowright / \circlearrowright / \circlearrowright$ buttons to select your preferences. You will be able to adjust:

Important Tips:

- Back-up your personal data before plugging in your USB to the TV. We do not assume liability for any loss of data due to misuse or malfunction.
- You cannot change channels while in recording mode.
- If the signal is interrupted while in recording mode, the recording will stop until the signal is established.
- Do not turn the TV off while it is in time-shift mode.
- The file recorded can only be used on this TV. Do not copy it to any other device.
- When connecting or disconnecting the USB storage device, ensure the TV is not in USB mode, otherwise the USB device or the files stored on it may be damaged.

Before you can record with this TV (including time-shift recording), you must insert your USB storage device into the USB port.

Recording Live TV

Press REC/D.SETUP once - start recording.

Press **REC/D.SETUP** again to view detailed information.

Stop Recording

When a program is being recorded in the background (while the TV is in standby mode), the Standby/On light will flash white. Recording, scheduled recording and pause live TV functions only work in DTV mode (free-to-air).



Playback



Press the ►► /INDEX button then navigate to File Manager and press OK to display the list of recorded programs.

Use the \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown buttons to select a recorded file.

Press the **OK** button to start playback in Full Screen Mode.



Pause Live TV (Time-shift)

Temporarily pause the live TV signal, then resume playback at your convenience.

Before you can record with this TV (including time-shift recording), you must insert your USB storage device into the USB port.



Start Time-shift

Press the **▶**I button on the remote to enter time-shift mode.

Press the **▶II** or OK buttons to resume playing the program.





Stop Time-shift

Press the **D** button to exit time-shift.



The USB storage device won't retain recorded data after you exit the time-shift function.

DVD Mode

Basic DVD Movie Playback

Press the **SOURCE** button on the back panel, or on the remote control, to switch the unit to DVD mode.



Before placing a disc into the disc compartment, make sure there is no disc inside. Hold the disc without touching its surfaces. Position it with the readable (mirror) side facing towards you. The disc will automatically enter the disc compartment, or you can press the **TV/RADIO/EJECT** button on the remote control to put the disc into the disc compartment.

Once the disc is in the disc compartment, the player starts reading the disc immediately.

When a menu screen appears on the unit, press the $\blacktriangle/$ / $\checkmark/$ > buttons, or the number buttons, to select the chapter/track number, then press **OK** to confirm.

To stop playing and return to the menu screen, press the **TITLE/EXIT** or **D.MENU/GUIDE** button on the remote control.

Stopping Play

Press the **b**utton to stop playback.

When the player is stopped, it records the point on the DVD where STOP was pressed (RESUME function). Press the **▶I** button again to resume playback from this point. When the disc is ejected or **■** is pressed again, the RESUME function will be cleared.

Skipping Ahead or Backwards

Skipping ahead: During playback, press the ►► /INDEX button to skip the next chapter (DVD) or track (Video CD/CD).

Skipping backward: During playback, press the K◀ button to skip the previous chapter (DVD) or track (Video CD/CD).

Fast Forward/Fast Backward

During playback, press the ◀ or ▶ buttons to fast backward/forward.

Press **▶**I button to resume normal play.

Pause/Play

During playback, press the **▶**I button to pause playback, press it again to resume normal playback.



Viewing From Different Angles

Some DVDs may contain scenes which have been shot simultaneously from a number of different angles. For discs that support multiple angles, press the **MANGLE** button to view the same scene from a different angle.

Go To

Press the **/GOTO** button repeatedly to select the item you want to set and enter a time number, chapter number, track number, etc., then press **OK**. Accordingly, the disc will be played from the selected point.

Display

Press the **I** (**DISPLAY**) button to display the playing status of your disc.



Repeat Play

Press the /REPEAT button during playback, it will repeat play one chapter or one title (for DVD disc), or repeat play the track (for VCD/CD).



Press the **/A-B** button at the point where repeat play is to be ended (B). Repeat play of the selection between points A and B starts.

Press the **/A-B** button again to return to normal play.

Zoom Play

This function allows you to zoom into the picture to enlarge it, or zoom out.

Press the **SIZE/ZOOM** button when playing.

Use the navigation buttons to scroll across the enlarged picture.

Changing the Audio Soundtrack Language (on DVD/VCD discs)

It is possible to change the audio soundtrack language to a different language from the one selected at the initial settings. (This function works only with discs on which multiple audio soundtrack languages are recorded.)

When playing a disc, press the AUDIO/LANG button to select the desired soundtrack language, if available.

NOTE: When no soundtrack languages are recorded, pressing this button will have no effect.

Use the A/V/ </ buttons to select the folder you want to play, then press **OK** to confirm.

On the file selection page, press the K or ► /INDEX buttons to turn to the previous or next page.

Press the — /**REPEAT** button on the remote control to change the play mode.

- SINGLE: play one file only.
- REPEAT ONE: repeat one file.
- REPEAT FOLDER: all the files in the folder will be played repeatedly.
- FOLDER: all the files in the folder will be played.

NOTE: The available repeat modes may vary for different discs.

Movie File Playback (movie files stored on a data CD)



Insert a disc which contains movie files and after a few seconds, the screen will show all the folders on the disc.

Use the A/V/ </ F buttons to select the folder you want to play, then press the **OK** button to confirm.

Use the $\blacktriangle/\checkmark/\checkmark/\checkmark$ buttons to select the desired movie file from the files displayed in this folder, then press the **>II** or **OK** button to start playback.

During normal playback, press the K or ►► /INDEX button to play the previous or next file.

Press ► /INDEX button to skip to the next picture or H button to skip to the previous picture. If no key is pressed for three seconds, it will skip to next picture automatically.

Rotating and Flipping Pictures

Press ► to rotate the picture clockwise; press ◄ to rotate it anti-clockwise.

Press \blacktriangle to flip the picture vertically; press \checkmark to flip it horizontally.

Picture Shrink/Zoom

Press the **SIZE/ZOOM** button repeatedly to enlarge or shrink the picture to 50%, 75%, 100%, 125%, 150% and 200%.

NOTE: If the picture is enlarged, use the ▲/▼/ ◄/► buttons to pan across other portions of the picture.

Video CD Playback

When playing a VCD 2.0 with playback control (PBC), the player will show the VCD version.

Press the number buttons to select a corresponding track.

Example: To play track 9, press 0 and 9, several seconds later, it will automatically switch to track 9. To play track 15, press 1 and 5, several seconds later, it will automatically switch to track 15.

Press the \mathbf{M} or \mathbf{M} /INDEX button to play the previous or next track.

DVD Menus

The DVD player function of this TV set contains different settings menus where you can program your preferred settings. Once you have programed any settings, the unit will retain them in its memory until you change them, even when switching the unit to standby mode. This means you can always operate the system under the same conditions.

Menu Navigation

Press the **REC/D.SETUP** button on the remote control.

Use the $\blacktriangle/\checkmark/\checkmark/\checkmark$ buttons to select the preferred item, then press **OK** to display the setup page where you can adjust values.

Use the $\blacktriangle/\checkmark/\checkmark/\succ$ buttons to adjust the item, then press **OK** to confirm the setting.

Press the **REC/D.SETUP** button again to close the setup menu.

Use the *ব* / ► buttons to switch to another main setup item. Then press the ► or **OK** button to enter the submenu page.

Press the < button to return to the previous menu page.

General Setup Page

- TV Display: This setting is for selecting the TV output mode. Available options:
- Normal/PS (Pan & Scan mode), Normal/LB (Letter Box mode)
 Wide: 16:9 (Wide Screen mode).
- OSD Language: This is for choosing your desired OSD language.
- Screen Saver: Set to ON, a screen saver will appear if the unit is left idle and no operation is carried out for five minutes.
- Last Memory: Enter another input source (except USB) during disc playback, and then back to DVD input source again, this unit will resume playback from the point where last playback was stopped, if Last Memory is set to ON.

Audio Setup Page

- Downmix: Use this item to select the desired audio output mode.
 Available options:
 - LT/RT: Left/Right mix mode.
 - Stereo mode.

Preference Setup Page

- TV Type: Select the TV system.
- Audio: Use this item to select the desired audio language, if your disc contains multiple audio languages.
- Disc Menu: Use this item to select the desired language of your disc menu, if your disc menu contains multiple menu languages.
- Program Control: Use this item to select the desired program rating.
- Password: Use this item to change the password. Input the password using the number buttons on the remote control. The default password is "0000".

NOTE: If you forget the password, please use the master password "4711".

• Default: Use this item to reset to factory settings.

Disc Handling and Maintenance Tips

- Hold the disc by the edges so the surface will not be soiled with fingerprints. Fingerprints, dirt and scratches can cause skipping and distortion.
- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing utensils.

- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzene, thinner or static electricity prevention liquids.
- Be careful not to drop or bend the disc.
- Do not insert more than one disc in the disc compartment.
- Do not try to close the disc cover when the disc is not inserted properly.
- Be sure to store the disc in its exclusive case when not in use.
- **DO NOT** store discs in humid or dusty areas, or where they are exposed to direct sunlight or sources of heat (such as a heating appliance).

Cleaning Dirty Discs

If a disc is dirty, wipe the surface gently with a soft cloth, dampened with a little water (no other liquids).

When wiping discs, always move the cloth from the centre hole towards the outside, which will not cause distortion. (If you wipe the disc using a circular motion, circular scratches are likely to occur, which will cause distortion).

If the disc is brought from a cold to a warm environment, moisture may form on the disc. Wipe this moisture off with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth before using the disc.
